Upcoming Obedience Rule Changes

Effective January 1, 2012 there are a number of significant rule changes coming into effect for CKC Obedience. Detailed wording is still being finalized but here is a brief overview of the most significant changes to be ready for.

- Revised entrance eligibility requirements for novice, open and utility classes.
- Circle Left, Circle Right exercise in Pre-Novice is replaced by a Figure Eight exercise.
- Novice Stand for Examination now done off leash.
- Novice Intermediate Honour exercise is replaced by a Recall Over the High Jump.
- Revisions to the number of boards used for each distance in the Broad Jump.
- Variable order of the exercises in Open B.
- Dogs that leave position in the Long Sit exercise will now automatically be excused from the Long Down exercise.
- New Utility B class with variable order of the exercises being introduced.
- Order of exercises in Open B and Utility will be posted prior to the class.
- Revised procedure for runoffs.
- Heeling patterns will now be either posted or the first competitor in class given 10 minutes advance notice.
- New judging requirements for Drop on Recall, Moving Stand and Run-Offs.

There were approximately 130 items on the Board agenda relating to these changes so expect to see many many more when the details are published later this year. Stay tuned.

Remember to bring your club membership card and your dog's trialing card if it has one.

More Bragging



Zephyr (OTCh, ATChC, VCh, Am/BISS Can Ch Signet's "Way To Go!" Woodruff, Can (DD HA SDA AgX AgXJ RE), Am (CDX HSAs RA NA NAJ), RX-MCL, STDsd, HRDII, RLFII, HTADI, BronzeAOM, ExStBronze, ExGBronze, ExJBronze, MSDC, MSCDC, VBA, EAC, TN-E, TG-O, OCC, OJC, HP-N, WV-N, CGC, CRTX, VX, AOM, MVC).

Funny how summer is either a do nothing time or full steam ahead. This year Zephyr & I had a bit of both. June 11-12 we were at Fido's Farm (Olympia, WA) running AHBA (American Herding Breed Assoc.) Large Flock trials. In these trials you move a large flock of sheep

across 'bridges', down narrow 'roads', through panels and narrow alleyways, from small pens to large fields and visa versa; to a predetermined graze area and let them graze and so forth. Level 2 includes a drive to, and through, an obstacle (with the handler as a handlers cone) so it was challenging, but in the end we came home with our **RLFII** (Ranch Large Flock level 2) title.



June 16-17 we were at Downriver Farm (Hope) competing in CKC Arena trials. Arena trials are concerned with the precise movement of stock from one obstacle to another in an arena (as opposed to larger field). Zephyr finished his **HA** (Herding Advanced) title with a **RHIT** (Reserve High In Trial) and Reserve High Combined for the weekend. He is the first Smooth Collie to earn the HA title.



After earning a HA title, dogs can accumulate Championship points (based on placement and the number of dogs competing in the Advanced class) and HX (Herding Excellent) Q's. For a HX, dogs require 10 Advanced Q's with scores of 85 or more. To earn a Herding Championship the dog must earn Advanced QS under at least 3 judges; win 2 High in Class placements, one a 3-pt major; and accumulate 15 Ch pts.

June 25-26 we were in Mill Bay competing in more CKC Arena trials. At the end of the weekend Zephyr had earned a HIT (High In Trial), two HX Q's and 6 Championship points (one his 3-pt major win)!

July 1-2-3 we were back at Mill Bay exhausted but competing in yet more CKC Arena trials. That weekend Zephyr came home with a HIT, a RHIT, a HIC, 3 HX Q's and 7 more Championship points. Unfortunately we pulled the same set of heavy sheep (meaning they are difficult to drive) on the last day so we NQ'd both runs. Had we Q'd a run he would have earned his Herding & Dual Championship titles – titles no Collie (Rough/Smooth) has yet earned.



July 16-17 we were back at Downriver Farm (Hope) running ASCA (Australian Shepherd Club of America) herding trials. Although over whelmed and tired from a 4-day herding camp just before, Zephyr earned his **STDd** (Started Trial Dog – ducks) title.

The August long weekend we were at Vic City where Zephyr completed his **OTCh** (Obedience Trial Champion) title with 2 decent utility scores in the 190's. This also qualifies Zephyr for his AWCA (Am. Working Collie Assoc.) **GVCh** (Grand Versatility Championship).

And in September we earned an invitation to the *2011 Canadian National All-Breed Herding Championship Showcase*. The top 20 Advanced, top 10 Intermediate and top 10 Started herding dogs are invited to this event. Zephyr ranked #3 Advanced behind clinician/instructor Lynn Leach and a Border Collie from back east. Last year the showcase was held in Niagara Falls. This year it will be indoors at Thunderbird Park in Langley Thanksgiving weekend. The "Champion" will walk home with \$1,000 cash and a pile of prizes. Numerous local dogs have qualified and will be attending. Unfortunately we were not able to compete due to an injury, however, we were there to cheer our fellow herders on. It was very disappointing as it's a once in a life-time opportunity, but our dogs always come first.
