I hope you have all had an enjoyable summer and are looking forward to our fall training session. The Training Committee has made some changes of instructors for some of the classes and I, for one, am looking forward to my new class.

At the end of the last session and at our last meeting there was much discussion about trying to encourage more people from our classes to continue on to trialing with their dogs. It is a fact that in today's dog training community there is a lot of competition for participants. There are many other disciplines out there such as agility, herding, and field work that take precedence over obedience trialing for many dog owners. Not everyone, however, is interested in these other pursuits.

I was speaking with Shirley Hubenig, one of our trial judges in the spring who lives in Calgary. I have known Shirley for almost 30 years. I was talking to her about the fact that our obedience entries are suffering as a result of other disciplines taking precedence. She informed me that in Alberta obedience trials still get really good entries.

The last few local obedience trials have had a very poor entry in the Novice classes. The Open B and Utility classes continue to have a relatively good showing. If we don't do our best to bring new people to our sport, obedience as a competitive discipline is in serious trouble in our area. Those Novice dogs are the up-and-coming entries for the higher classes later.

NOSA is an obedience club. We all need to do our best to encourage new students to continue on with their dogs. They may not come to their first class with that aim in mind, but it's up to us to make these students feel welcome and offer encouragement to continue on to trialing. We were all beginners with our first dog at some point in time. Think about what made you stick with it.

Any of you who may be reading this that are relatively new to dog training, do you have any suggestions of ways we can help you? Do you have questions about trialing? Our training staff has a very wide variety of knowledge, and decades of experience. Please feel free to ask, and if the person you ask doesn't have the answer, they can surely point out someone else who can help you.

## GOOD MEMBER PRACTICES

In the interest of keeping our training environment a safe and pleasant place to train for everyone, all handlers are asked to follow a few simple practices.

Exercise and relieve your dog **before** entering the building.

Exercise your dog in the grassy area only and **always** stoop and scoop up stools.

Do not allow males to lift their legs on the corners of the building or in the entry ways.

Keep your dog on leash at **all** times. The only exceptions are off-leash work in the rings.

If your dog has an accident in the hall, find an instructor, assistant or other club member to hold your dog while **you** clean up using the clean-up materials supplied.

**All** dogs must enter the hall

through the green double doors, on the south side of the hall. These are just to the right of the three huge doors with the floor-to-ceiling windows. **No** dogs may enter through the front doors of the facility.

When inside the building, please keep your dogs on the matting.

If your dog has a communicable disease or infestation or you have a female in season, please attend your class, but leave your dog home. You can practise with your dog at home.

If your dog is ill or lame, please leave it home, but attend yourself so you will be able to catch up once your dog is well.

If you have to miss a class, please let your instructor know ahead of time.

If you feel uncomfortable with your instructor/assistant, with any training techniques, or another dog in the class, please express your concerns to either your instructor or Training Chairman (Irene Copus 656-1938).

Feel free to stay and watch the more advanced classes. You may want to put your dog in the car while you do this. If you keep your dog with you, please keep him/her under control at all times.

If your dog is aggressive toward either people or other dogs, please let your instructor know. We will help you without putting you, your dog, the instructor, other students or their dogs at risk.

High trial in both trials was earned by Susan Scobie from Vancouver with scores of 197 and 195 in the Novice B class. Second high in trial was earned by Gillian Anglin in Trial #1 with 195 1/2 and by Peggy York in Trial #2 with 194, both Greater Vic members.

Class winners were: in Novice A, Heidi Von Der Wense (182) and Liz Jones (189); in Novice B, Susan Scobie as above; in Open A, Alva Kwas (188); in Open B, Gillian Anglin and Margot Jorgensen (189 1/2); and in Utility, Gillian Anglin (190 1/2).

NOSA members achieving passing scores were Charleen DeLong (186 1/2), Liz Jones (181 and 189) and Marilyn Clayton (193 and 191). Well done, all of you.

## CONFESSIONS OF AN AGILITY ADDICT—by Liz Hayes

I am self-confessed agility addict. I came by it honestly, from a nice, safe obedience background. Every time I think I have it under control, I am exposed to another new, innovative method of FUN!

If it isn't backyard training, which is never-ending and the most rewarding, it's classes, practices, seminars, workshops, camps, and the ultimate – the trial. Trials are where you can have the most fun. They are the ultimate "proofing" ground. 99% of the time, the "goofs" or faults are the handler's. It's amazing what a little stress will do to a handler, or a little black poodle!

Agility trials are where you go to hang out with other dog people, and if you're lucky, the trials are out of town, so you have a whole weekend of unadulterated fun with people who don't think you are totally nuts. One of my best friends is 75 years old, and runs a very fast border collie. Try telling her that agility is too physical! There was also a 10-year-old at the National competition. Age is not a factor! Nor is the type or breed of dog. All dogs are welcome. Two of my favourites are a tiny Yorkie and a huge Cane Corso, both from Vancouver. It is very obvious that they are both having a wonderful time running courses. Obviously the jump heights are set to the size of the dog. The dogs run "naked". This means no collars or leashes, so if your dog isn't having fun – he'll just leave the ring. It is your job to make sure they are enjoying it. Force is not a factor.

One of the things that has me so very addicted is that every single "run" is different. You don't know until the day of the trial what course you will be running. There is a course map and you have 5-7 minutes to "walk" the course and decide your "strategy".

There are several different types of courses or games, so you and your dog will absolutely never get bored. The better you get at it, the more ways to handle the course, the better you want to be. Running a course in absolute harmony with your dog is an unbelievable high!

There is no doubt that AGILITY is truly the MOST fun you can have with your dog.

On September 9, 2006, eight NOSA members and their dogs teamed up to represent NOSA in Wild Arc's Annual Walk/Run, at Royal Roads University, to support injured and orphaned wild animals. Wild ARC is the only wildlife rehabilitation facility on Southern Vancouver Island, treating over 1,600 wild animals annually.

The event was well organized with lots of good food, energizing music, numerous prizes (Alix's 11½ year-old Paka won a lovely basket of goodies as the oldest canine participant), beautiful scenic routes, and perfect weather. Since a few of us were sporting injuries, we chose the 3 km walk.

There was a good turn out of runners, walkers, dogs and kids. And the afternoon wound up by releasing a Great Blue Heron that had injured its wing several months ago when it got caught in fencing. The total raised on the day was \$11,000, and the NOSA team contributed \$470.
